

## Training opportunities for Multi-Actor Partnerships (MAP)

### Trainings

[Multi-Actor Partnership Essentials \(Online\)](#) – 08-10 April 2025, in English

This training provides a basic understanding of Multi-Actor Partnerships (MAPs), why they are critical and how they can be successful. It inspires participants to consider MAPs for their initiatives and issues vis-à-vis other options, such as advocacy networks.

This training is critical for participants and organisations designing or re-thinking initiatives using a MAP approach. We provide case studies and tools for analysis and planning, that will make your MAP more likely to succeed.

[Effective Collaboration in Multi-Actor Partnerships \(Online\)](#) – 27-29 May 2025, in English

This training is for MAP facilitators, leaders, and those who want to be actively involved. It is a self-reflective and immersive journey that builds leadership and collaboration habits, creates accountability among MAP actors, and introduces adaptive management.

### Developing learning paths

The Civil Society Academy International supports initiatives funded by the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) that use a multi-actor partnership approach to develop learning pathways capable of advancing your initiative.

The main outputs of the process are:

- A detailed 12-18 month learning path that addresses the MAP's collective and individual needs, including priority topics, delivery methods, and potential support organisations.
- A broader 3 to 4-year pathway based on the collective vision of the MAP.
- An assessment of the status of the MAP, including its performance, opportunities and challenges.

To develop the pathway in a participatory way, we will engage the core team of the MAP in a 2-3-day online workshop. The workshop takes the team through a process of (a) analysis, including a deep dive into priority topics, (b) developing key insights on the current status of the MAP and (c) planning of the pathways. We use a virtual collaboration platform, usually MIRO, for this process.

The service is supported by bengo and free for initiatives funded by the BMZ that use a multi-actor partnership approach.
